1. CALL TO ORDER

Chief's Report – December 2019

1) **Police Facility update**

The Chief advised that JPW has completed the outstanding work and the fume hood is on order and should be installed in January.

2) **Canine Unit**

The Chief advised that the training is going very well and should be finished by January 22nd.

3) **Criminal Investigations/Drug Unit**

The Chief advised that the Unit is very busy and doing excellent work.

4) **Community Safety and Well Being Plan**

The Chief advised that he and Clerk Linda White have been attending meetings with communities from Bruce and Grey counties to work together to create and present a Community and Safety Well-Being Plan. He noted that the Plan is progressing well and is requesting a resolution from the Board to represent the Saugeen Shores Police Services Board in the creation of the plan and presentation when completed.

That Chief Bellai be appointed as the Saugeen Shores Police Services Board's representative on the Community Safety and Well-Being Planning Advisory Committee.




12. CLOSED TO PUBLIC
